

Greetings,

This message is for Midget AAA League players and their parental authorities.

We have enclosed an explanation of the players' **personalized development program**.

The PDP program was proposed following the Hockey Summit in Montreal. The LHJMQ [Quebec Major Junior Hockey League] sponsors the program, and several LHJMQ teams are actively involved, along with their players.

We wish to thank the LHJMQ for this initiative to improve the player development process.

The League's 15 teams will take part in the PDP program during the 2016-2017 season, as an integral part of the development program for all of our players.

**Each team has an administrator** with access to all of the program's components, and only this administrator may give other persons access to individual components. For example, a team's academic advisor may have access to the academic component only, and not be able to consult the other components.

Note that a Midget AAA team does not have access to information about players on another Midget AAA team.

**The League has designated Georges Marien as the administrator. He has access to all of the program's components, for all teams.**

He has given Micheline Roy access to the ACADEMIC component only, for the 15 teams. She manages each team's academic advisor for the League.

He has given Robert Lalonde access to the INJURIES component only, for the 15 teams.

He has given Jos Canale access to the HOCKEY component only, for the 15 teams.

He has given Paul Ménard (Hockey Québec) access to the ON-ICE / OFF-ICE TESTING and PLAYER EVALUATION components, for the 15 teams.

We ask each player's parental authority for permission to forward all PDP information to the LHJMQ, once the player's LDHMAAAQ [Quebec Midget AAA Hockey League] season games are over, and to forward player evaluation information and on-ice / off-ice testing information to Paul Ménard (Hockey Québec) only.
